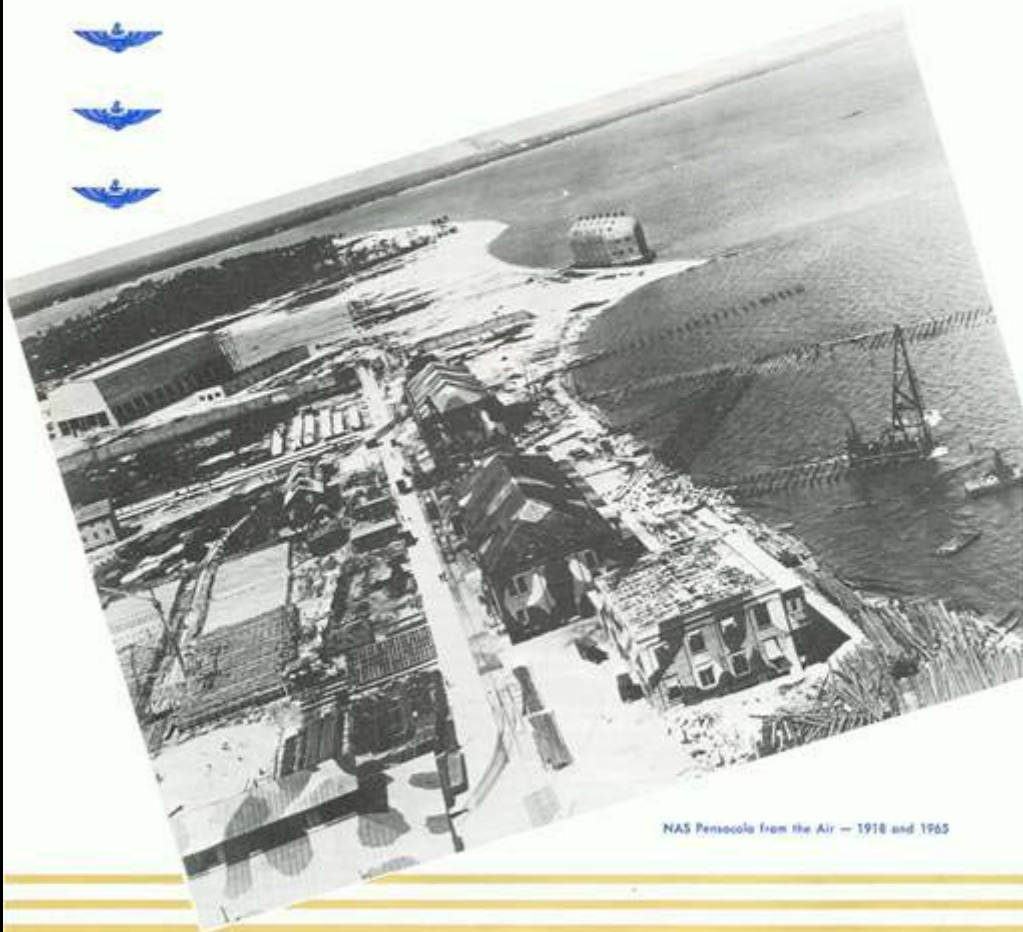

NSACOLA

On Florida's Gulf Coast, just south of the Alabama line, lies the strategically situated and large harbor of Pensacola. It is here that "The Cradle of Naval Aviation", the country's first naval aviation station, was established. Comprising 4,218 acres, the site now occupied by the Naval Air Station has a colorful historical background dating back to the early 16th century.

When, in 1559, Don Tristan de Luna settled here with 2,000 followers, Pensacola, itself, became the site of the first settlement made in what is now the United States. Although this was the first settlement, it was not continuous for a hurricane completely destroyed the early settlement and the settlers abandoned the project. It was not re-established until several years after the settlement of St. Augustine.

In 1825 the Secretary of the Navy appointed a special Board of Commissioners consisting of three Navy Captains, William Bainbridge, L. Worrington and James Biddle, to make an investigation and select a site for the establishment of a navy yard. Their report, recommended by the present site of the Naval Air Station as a Naval Station. This station had been authorized by Congress the previous year.

By 1910 Congress had let appropriations for the Navy decrease to such an extent that the Navy had to make drastic retrenchments. One of these was the closing of the Pensacola Navy Yard and Station.

Also, in this year 1910, the first naval officers were ordered to learn to fly under the instruction of the Wright Brothers and Mr. Glenn Curtis.

and by 1913, naval aviation was in its initial stages of development. The few airplanes the Navy owned and the pitifully few personnel engaged in aviation had no base, so a Board was appointed to examine possible sites. This Board inspected, among other places, the abandoned navy yard at Pensacola and unanimously chose it as the finest possible site for a naval air station. Their wisdom has been proved through the years and today, it is one of the finest and largest air stations in the world.

During World War I, 999 pilots were trained here. During the gradual development of naval aviation, Pensacola became more and more important and during World War II a total of over 28,000 received their training here.

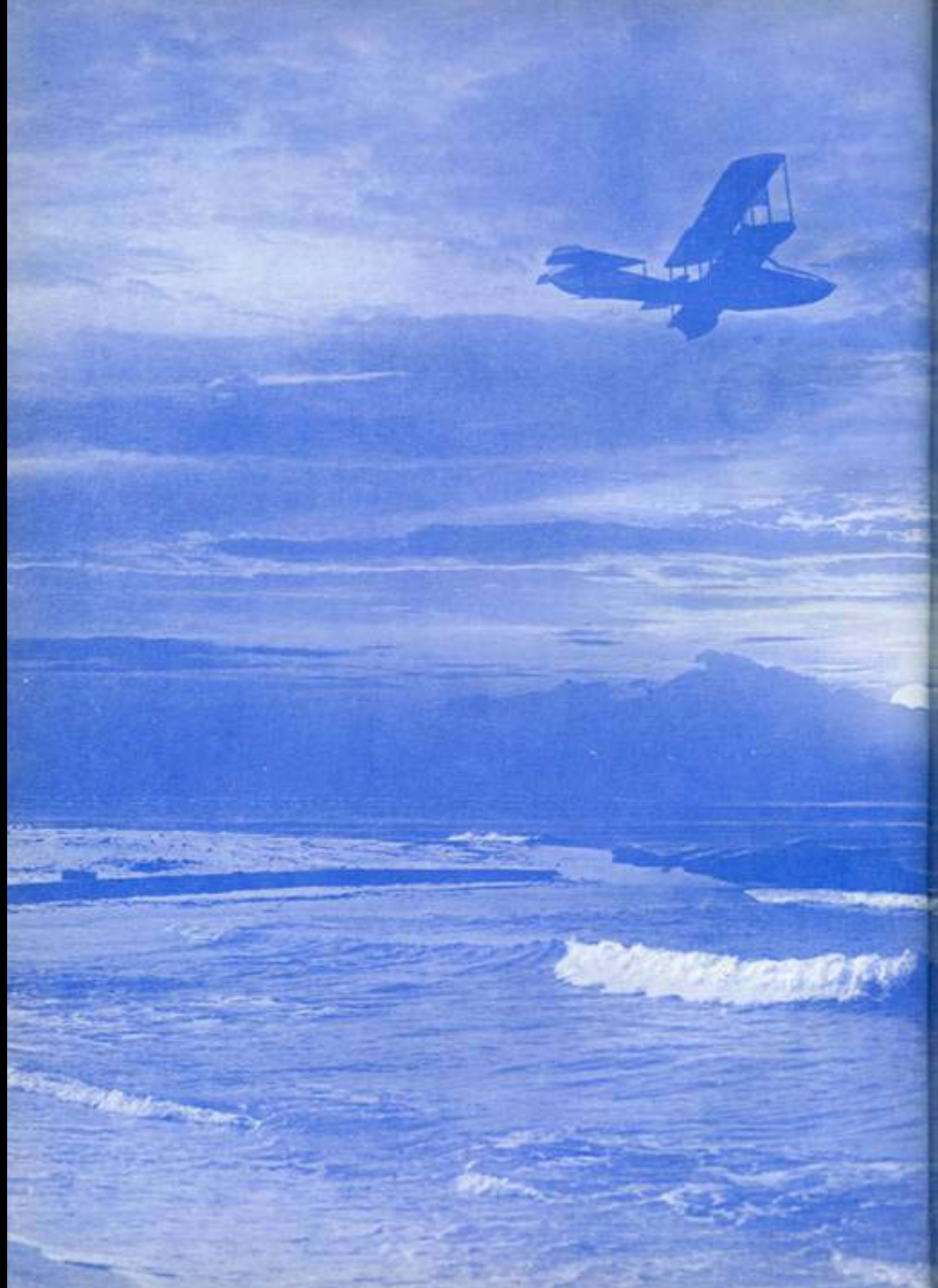

ALEXANDER S. HEYWARD, JR.

VICE ADMIRAL, U. S. NAVY
CHIEF, NAVAL AIR TRAINING

Vice Admiral Alexander Salley Heyward, Jr. was promoted to his present three star rank June 25, 1964 upon assuming duty as Chief of Naval Air Training with headquarters at Pensacola, Florida.

A native of Columbia, S. C., he is a 1930 graduate of the U. S. Naval Academy, Annapolis, Maryland, and has been a qualified naval aviator since 1932.

During his 34 year naval career, Admiral Heyward has held various staff billets and has commanded a number of aircraft squadrons and ships. His commands included Patrol Squadron 73, the sea-plane tender *Timbaler*, the aircraft carrier *Lexington* and Carrier Division 5.

Before assuming his present duties as Chief of Naval Air Training, he served for three years as Deputy Chief of Naval Personnel and Assistant Chief of the Bureau of Naval Personnel in Washington.

Admiral Heyward's wartime decorations include the Legion of Merit with Gold Star in lieu of a second award and Combat "V".

He is married to the former Virginia Nicholson of Camden, S. C. The Heywards presently reside at Quarters A aboard the Pensacola Naval Air Station.



JOHN J. LYNCH

REAR ADMIRAL, U. S. NAVY
CHIEF OF NAVAL AIR BASIC TRAINING

John J. Lynch began his naval career as an aviation cadet at Naval Air Station, Pensacola, Florida on July 12, 1935. Through subsequent advancement and his transfer from the Reserve to the Regular Navy, he was selected to his present rank in May 1964 and holds the distinction of being the first Naval Aviation Cadet to hold Flag rank.

During the war Admiral Lynch's utter disregard for his own personal safety and other evidences of courage above the ordinary earned him the Navy Cross citation, the Distinguished Flying Cross, Air Medal with Gold Star and many other medals.

In 1954 he became a student at the Naval War College and in July 1955 assumed command of the Naval Auxiliary Air Station, Whiting Field, Milton, Florida.

He entered the diplomatic arena in 1957, reporting to Moscow for a two year assignment as U. S. Naval Attache and Naval Attache for Air.

From there he assumed various fleet commands until he assumed command as Chief of Naval Air Basic Training at Pensacola.

Rear Admiral Lynch is married to the former Virginia Boutelle of La Jolla, California. He has a stepson, Lieutenant Byron Charles Gwinn, II, USN a Navy Doctor now on duty at U. S. Naval Hospital, San Diego, California.

T R A I N I N G

Becoming a flying officer in today's U. S. Navy takes a lot of hard work. From the day a student enters Pre-Flight, until he receives his commission and wings, every activity of his training has but one goal — molding the finest officer and flyer in the world. The curriculum consists of academic subjects, military bearing, physical fitness and flight training. Consequently, everything the student does in the classroom, on the athletic field and in the air is aimed at producing the best naval aviator in the world.



U.S. NAVAL SCHOOL PRE-FLIGHT

The U. S. Naval School, Pre-Flight is the first step for Aviation Cadets who set out on the path leading to Navy Wings of Gold and a commission in the Navy or the Marine Corps.

Pre-Flight School provides Naval and Marine Officers—who are undergoing flight training—with an introduction to aeronautical and aeronautically related subjects.

The command is located aboard the 5,500 acre Naval Air Station in Pensacola and is a unit of the Naval Air Basic Training Command. The present school is an outgrowth of the five World War II pre-flight schools which were scattered at universities throughout the country. These schools were consolidated into one Pre-Flight School at Iowa City, Iowa at the end of the war.

In December 1945, Pre-Flight moved to NAS Ottumwa, Iowa and remained there until July 1947 when it was transferred to its present location at NAS Pensacola.

The mission of Pre-Flight is twofold. It serves as an officer candidate school to equip Aviation Cadets for their future duties. It also provides potential flight students with a thorough mental and physical background which they will need when their flight training begins.

In fulfilling this mission, two programs are utilized. Cadets participate in a fourteen week course during which they receive 353 hours of training. The curriculum for officer students is made up of 166 hours during five weeks.

Pre-Flight training is divided into three departments—Academic, Physical Fitness-Survival, and Military. Each department is an essential part of the training program and a passing grade in each is necessary for graduation.

The Academic Department provides formal classroom instruction in aeronautical and Naval subjects. These include Naval Orientation, Aerodynamics, Study Skills, Leadership, Engineering, Aviation Science, and Navigation. In addition to the regular instruction, individual help, mock-ups, and visual aids are utilized to assist the student in understanding the essential material.

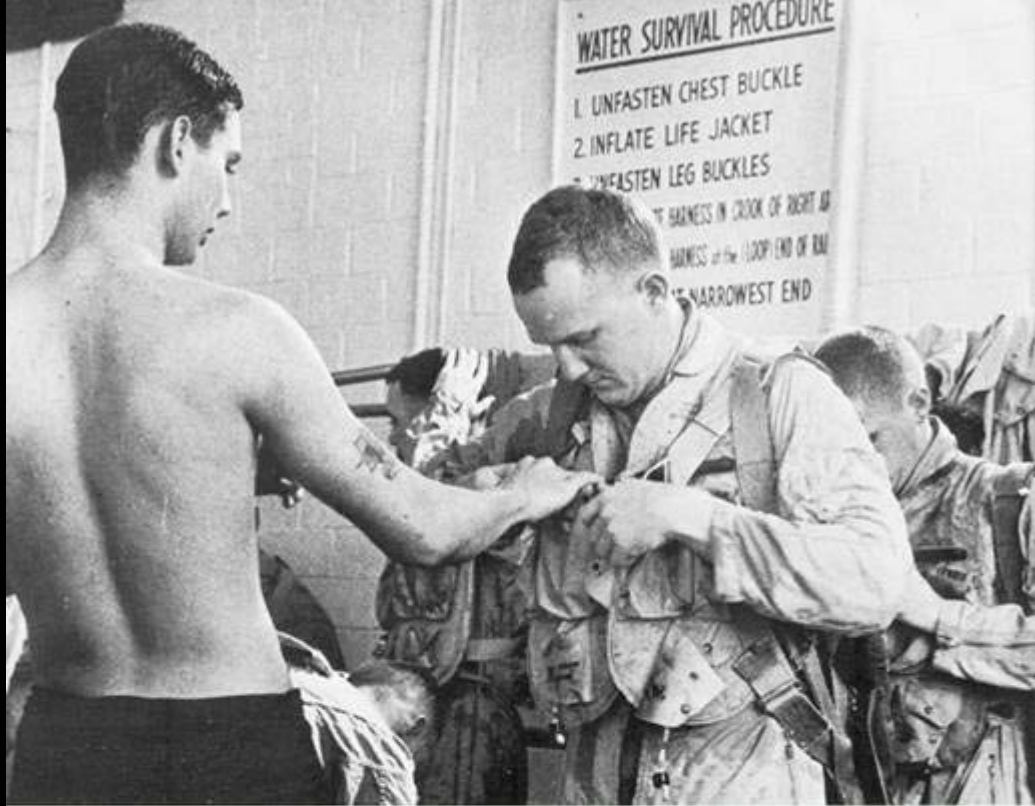
In the Physical Fitness-Survival Department, two aspects of aviation training are stressed—development of muscular coordination and survival at sea. Staffed by trained athletic instructors, this department develops the keen minds and agile bodies that are "musts" for alert and competent aviators. A spirit of sportsmanship and fair play is instilled in the students during their activities that remains with them long after they have completed their training.





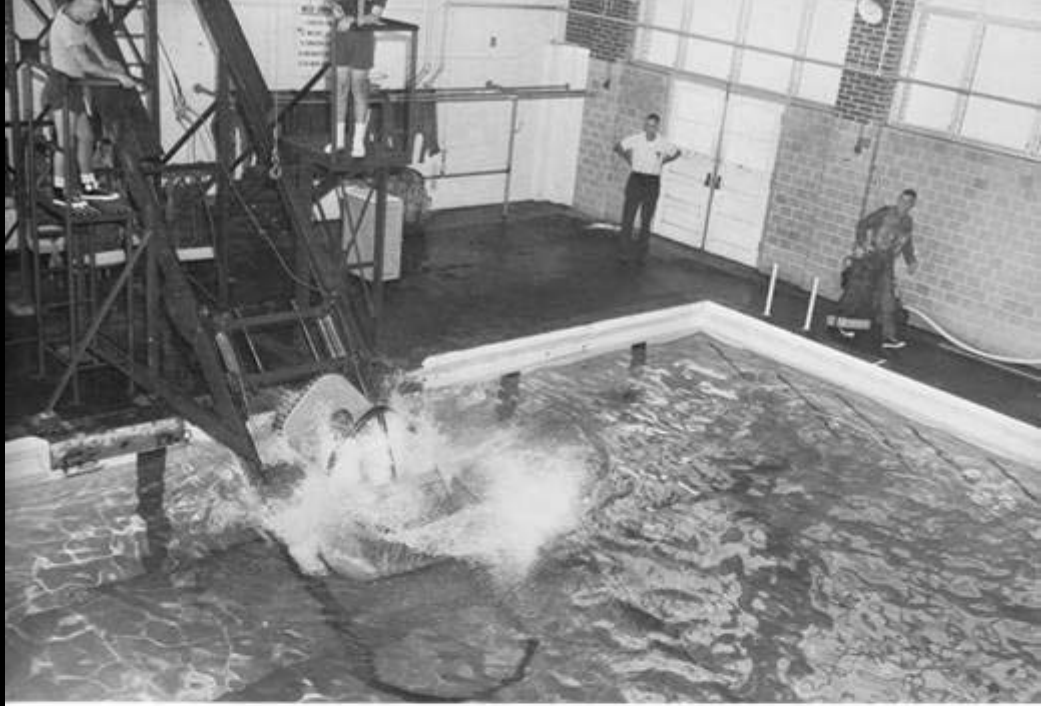
The Military Department contributes to the mission of the U. S. Naval School, Pre-Flight by implementing and supervising plans and policies relating to military training, discipline, and the general welfare of cadets assigned. Here students are issued and fitted with uniforms and instructed in their wear and care, learn military formations and procedures, military customs and traditions and develop those officer-like qualities which will enable them to become effective military leaders.





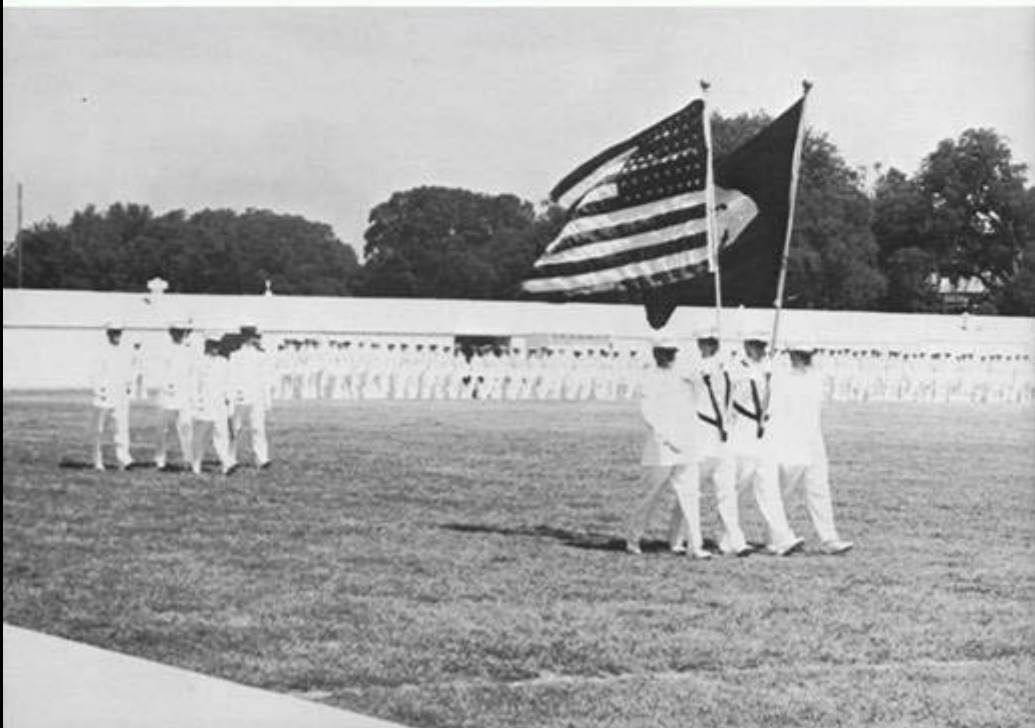




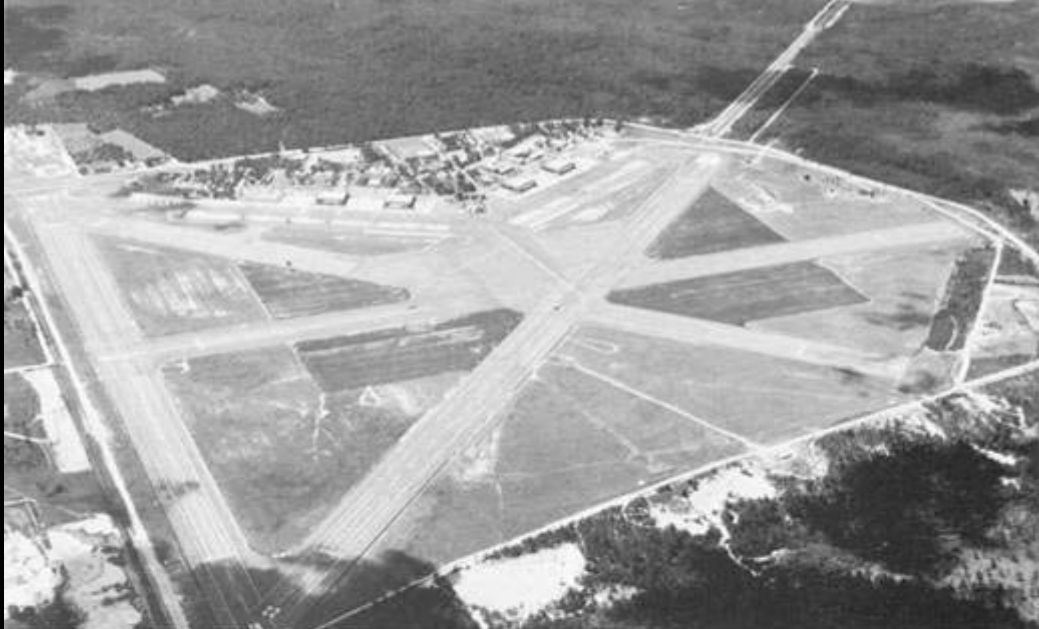

Saufley Field

The first solo flight, for student Naval Aviators, is the first of the many great thrills he will experience in his communion with plane and sky. It happens every day at Saufley Field in Pensacola.

At present Saufley employs the prop driven T-34 in fulfilling its mission of primary flight instruction. The T-34 was introduced to Saufley in the fall of 1956 and already over 11,500 students have completed this phase of their training in the "Mentor."

Saufley Field is about ten miles west of the School of Pre-Flight in Pensacola. Fourteen weeks



of intensive training are required before the student reaches Saufley and his first taste of actual flight instruction.

As the student approaches the base along the Saufley Field Access Road, he catches a glimpse of the long red and white line of planes that he will learn to know so well. There are over one hundred and forty planes on the "East Line" which is visible from this road.

The first few days at Saufley are spent on the routine check-in procedures and the student repeats the process that has become so familiar in his flight training . . . he is loaded down with books. Many, many hours of preparation are spent on the ground for each hour in the air. The initial indoctrination, however, includes the introduction to the student's first "squadron," Hangar 809 is the home of Training Squadron One, and is divided into sections for the four in-

dividual Flights: Flight 12, 13, 14 and Flight 18, the Marine Corps Flight. Prior to the commissioning of Training Squadron One there were six T-34 squadrons and one TT-1 jet squadron. The primary student is given a brief greeting by his individual flight leader or his assistant and he then checks in to ground training. Here he will spend his first week before returning to the hangar.

In ground school the nature of the courses studied changes somewhat from Pre-Flight. The material presented is, for the most part, directly related to the flying that will be done in the weeks ahead. Cockpit procedures, engineering and flight characteristics of the particular aircraft are covered.

After the two weeks of this, the big moment arrives; the student meets his instructor, and weather permitting, they check out on the flight schedules board for the flight line and the PS-1 hop. For





the next six weeks the student's time will be spent equally between ground school and the flight line. Every effort is made to unify the information presented on the ground and in the air in order to make the student's learning experience complete.

Although often not as exciting as the flight phase of training, ground school is an extremely important and vital part of the training. An attempt is made to make aviators who will understand every phase of the missions to which they will be assigned, and to make Naval Officers as well as aviators. The positions of leadership and responsibility to which the student can expect to fall heir are unequalled.

In the hangar the student will find a keen rivalry and a high "esprit de corps." Regular competitions are conducted for student of the week, flight of the month, numerous safety awards, and there are many athletic contests. Squadron parties

and Friday afternoon "Happy Hours" add greatly to the feeling of belonging that will prevail throughout the student's Naval Aviation career.

Flight-training at VT-1 is divided into two stages of instruction, pre-solo and precision.

In the pre-solo stage the student receives thirteen flights; eleven dual instructional flights; the PS-12 safe-for-solo check and the PS-13 solo. The dual instructional flights prepare the student for the solo flights he will receive in precision stage by giving him a thorough introduction to landing procedure and technique. He is also taught to cope with various emergencies that may arise and he is taught the local traffic patterns. Good airmanship and safety are stressed at all times.

The PS-12 check flight is flown with an instructor other than the student's regular instructor. Based on long experience of training and checking stu-





dents the check pilot determines whether or not the student is safe to go it alone. To indicate success on this flight the traditional "thumbs up" sign is given by the instructor.

The student's last flight in this stage is his long anticipated first solo flight. Every conceivable emotion has been co-pilot with students on this first solo, but, invariably, a feeling of tremendous pride has accompanied every student as he walked from his plane back to the hangar upon completion of this flight.

Soloing, in spite of its importance to the new pilot, is only the first in a long succession of hurdles to be taken before he is a qualified aviator. After the first solo, training intensifies and the student pilot must learn precision and proficiency flying.

In the precision stage the student refines maneuvers that were introduced in the pre-solo stage and

he learns many new ones. A student will generally fly one solo hop and one dual instructional hop while in this stage. The loop, the full cuban eight, the wingover, the barrel roll and the spin become familiar "lingo" in the hangar after the solo acrobatics flights.

The student finishes this phase of his training at VT-1 when he successfully completes his precision stage check. This hop is not only flown with a different instructor, but the instructor comes from another flight.

With the completion of Primary, the student has taken a big step in accomplishing his goal. His confidence in himself and his ability to handle a plane are now real. Although still a long way from his "Wings of Gold" the fledgling has had many experiences and is on his way to establishing habits that will remain with him throughout his life.

TRAINING SQUADRON 5

Training Squadron Five is the carrier qualification unit. When a student completes his training in the T-34 he transfers to Whiting Field for transition to the bigger, faster T-28. When the student is thoroughly competent in the '28 he returns to Saufley for the special training that distinguishes him as a Naval Aviator . . . carrier qualifications.

The student attends two days of ground school. Here he receives flight support and safety lectures, and exams. These consist mainly of carrier safety, performance characteristics of the aircraft as they relate specifically to carrier operations, and the operation of the mirror landing system.

Upon satisfactory completion of ground school and, particularly, the mirror test, the aspiring carrier pilot begins the MFCLP or Mirror Field Carrier Landing Practice phase of instruction. VT-5 is noted for its 0400 reveille. This offers the opportunity for a number of launches for field carrier landing practice before the heat of the day creates annoying turbulence. There are thirteen periods of instruction. The student receives three "demo" flights with an instructor. The remainder of the flights are solo. Approximately eight approaches are flown during each period. At the carrier the student makes two touch and go landings and six arrested landings.

Many students experience a bigger thrill from their

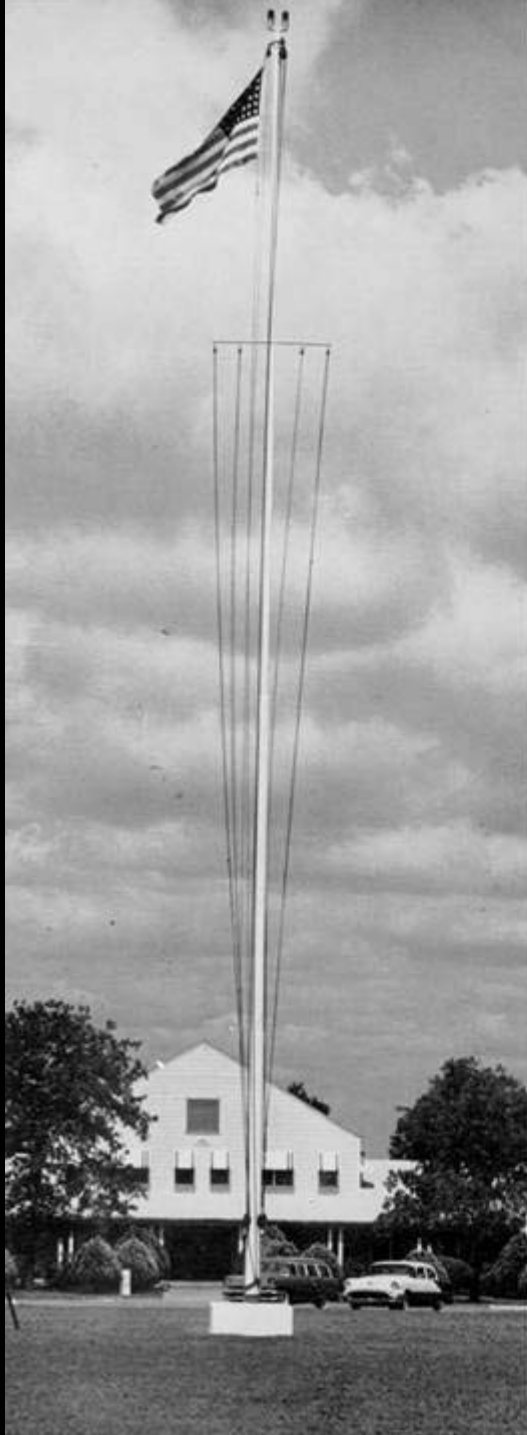

first carrier landings than from their first solo. Perhaps the reason for this is the tremendous anticipation and the suspense. Prior to soloing a student performs every maneuver with his instructor in the back seat that he will perform on his solo. In car-quats, however, seeing the carrier and performing the actual carrier landings is a completely new sensation the first time a student pilot goes aboard. In spite of the anxiety ahead of time, most students seem to agree that their basic carrier landings are easier than the MFCLP's.



NAAS

The U. S. Naval Auxiliary Air Station, Whiting Field, the largest auxiliary air station ever commissioned to train young men to fly, is named for Captain Kenneth Whiting, the sixteenth naval aviator and a pioneer in the development of the aircraft carrier. The field, officially opened in July, 1943, is situated on 3,000 acres of land in Santa Rosa county about 35 miles northeast of Pensacola and seven miles from the city of Milton, Florida.

The mission of Whiting Field is to provide facilities and support for tenant squadrons based here. The station fulfills its missions by providing many facilities and services to the military and civilian personnel who are stationed and work at Whiting. Among the facilities and services provided are administration, transportation, academic training, leadership training, recreation, airfields, and maintenance.

Whiting Field is the home of three complete commands: Training Squadrons Two, Three, and the station itself. Whiting is also responsible for the operation of five practice landing fields, Middleton, near Evergreen, Alabama, Brewton, Santa Rosa, Choctaw, and Holly fields.

Each year at Whiting approximately 1700 officers and cadets receive the best basic flying instruction available in the world today. These students receive their instruction from over 3,000 officers and enlisted men permanently stationed at Whiting.

During World War II, Whiting conducted basic and radio instrument training for the hopeful wearers of the wings of gold. With the ending of hostilities in 1945, medium and heavy bombers were based at Whiting for almost two years. During this period Whiting became a Naval Air Station and was placed under the command of Naval Air Advanced Training at Jacksonville, Florida. In 1948 the field reverted to its present status of an auxiliary air station and was returned to the Naval Air Basic Training Command.

Just prior to the outbreak of the Korean conflict, the famed "Blue Angels" made their home at Whiting along with the Navy's first jet training unit, JFU-ONE. With the outbreak of the Korean conflict, and the resultant step-up in aviation training, Whiting devoted itself to the primary phase of training in the SNJ. During the eight-year period from May 1948 through 1956 that primary training was conducted here, over 18,000 students graduated.

In October, 1956, the Instrument and Formation phase of basic training was moved to Whiting Field from Saufley Field and, in turn, Saufley took over primary training. Also, the arrival of the first T-28's of the over 300 now present at Whiting took place in 1956.

Since its beginning in the early years of World War II, Whiting Field has provided much for naval aviation, both as a training field and as an air station. The future can only tell what valuable service Whiting Field has provided for the training of the world's best aviators, who help defend the freedom of the entire free world.

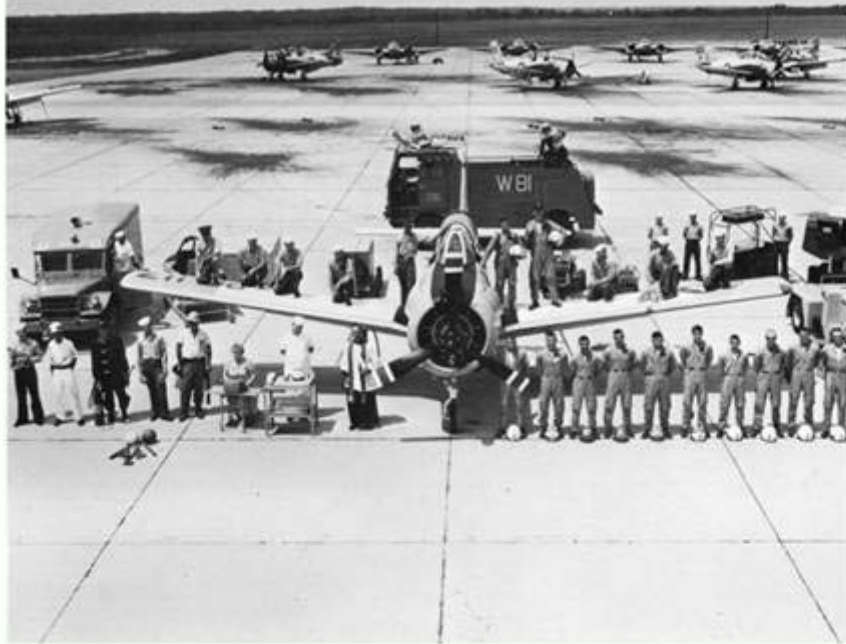

TRAINING SQUADRON 2

Training Squadron TWO, based at North Field on the U. S. Naval Auxiliary Air Station at Whiting Field, Milton, Florida was commissioned on May 1, 1960. The mission of the squadron is to indoctrinate the student with the T-28 Trojan training plane in Transition, Precision/Acrobatcs, Basic and Radio Instruments, Formation and Night Flying. This is a big step for the fledgling aviator because the T-28 is a much heavier aircraft, has more power, and climbs and cruises faster than the T-34 primary trainer in which the student was first introduced to Navy flying. As one instructor remarked "it's like driving a Cadillac after having driven a Volkswagen."

The first eight flights are dual and are devoted to teaching the student how to take off and land the aircraft, to do stalls and spins, and how to cope with high and low altitude emergencies. The ninth flight is a solo.

The next stage is precision/acrobatics which teach the student to make precision landings within a box painted on the runway and how to perform the following acrobatic maneuvers; wing-overs, loops, barrel rolls, half Cuban eights and Immelmans. This stage is designed to smooth out his basic air work, and teach him control of the aircraft throughout rapidly changing altitudes.

While in the transition, precision/acrobatic stages (TPA) he is also attending ground school. The normal routine is to fly for a half day and attend school the other half.

After completing the TPA stage, the student is ready to learn basic and radio instrument flying. This stage consists of eleven basic instrument flights under the blind flying hood teaching him to perform in three dimensions by using only his instruments without reference to the ground. Eight radio instrument flights follow, where by utilizing all radio equipment available to him, he learns to navigate under instrument weather conditions to and from strange airports.

The student is then introduced to the art of flying peculiar only to military aviation, tactical formation flying. The formation syllabus consists of twenty-two flights, twelve two plane, four four plane, two day navigation, two night landing, and finally two night navigation flights.

When a student has completed all stages of the flight syllabus, he is well qualified to leave Training Squadron TWO, where he has received over one third of his Naval Flight Training. TRAINING SQUADRON 3

The primary mission of Training Squadron THREE is the basic training of student Naval aviators in five phases of flight instruction in the North American T-28 Trojan: transition, precision/acrobatics (TPA), basic instruments (BI), radio instruments (RI), and formation tactics (F). Training Squadron THREE is located at the U. S. Naval Auxiliary Air Station, Whiting Field, Milton, Florida. The squadron is commanded by Commander A. R. SCHUKNECHT, with Commander D. T. KARNAGEL as the Executive officer. There are approximately 140 officers in the squadron, 30% of which are Marines; enlisted personnel number well over 600.

TRARON THREE trains over 700 flight students each year, maintaining about 140 aircraft. The student reports to VT-3 from primary training at VT-1; he is introduced to the T-28 and in the transition phase, learns everything about the aircraft, from take-off and landing procedures to coping with emergencies. In the TPA stage, which consists of fourteen flights, six dual and eight solo, the student is taught precision landings and acrobatic maneuvers.

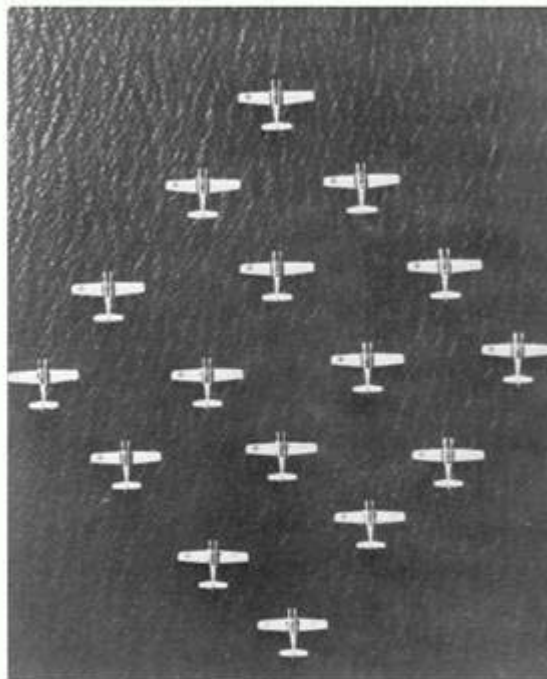
The student then goes on to the instrument phase of his training which begins with a series of lectures. He will then learn to fly "blind" on the ground using the basic link trainer, one step away from actual airborne operations. Once in the air, the student will be required to control his airspeed and altitude, as well as fly precise maneuvers, using only his instruments, without any visual reference outside the aircraft.

After completing eleven flights in the basic instrument stage, the student returns to the link trainer to commence the radio instrument stage of his training. Here he uses electronic radio aids to navigate from one radio station to the next. He uses both Omni stations and ground control approaches. At the satisfactory completion of the link trainer flights, the student commences the radio instrument phase in the T-28. The first four flights the student practices airways navigation and making instrument approaches to different radio facilities. His fifth flight is concerned with making ground controlled approaches (GCA's) to a predetermined airfield. The last three flights are planned by the student to fly to different airfields. He completes the RI training phase by making an actual or simulated instrument flight and approach to an airport.

In his last phase of training, the student is assigned to the formation flight unit. Here he is first taught two plane section work, which is the basis for all formation flying. After satisfactory completion of two plane work, the student progresses to four plane division work. Division formation is the standard tactical formation for all fleet fighters and attack squadrons. With completion of two solo day navigational flights and four night flights, the student is ready to progress on to his next squadron, which is a step closer to obtaining his Navy "Wings of Gold."

Training Squadron THREE thus forms an integral part of the Naval aviator's overall picture. Every man aboard, student, instructor, officer and enlisted can be proud of the role he plays in the defense of his country.

SQUADRON 6



TRAINING SQUADRON SIX (VT-6) has the mission of training pre-helicopter student aviators to be the best instrument pilots in the world. This mission is reflected in the squadron insignia consisting of a gyro horizon indicator. The upper left quadrant contains a compass and the lower right quadrant a needle-ball turn indicator. The upper right and lower left quadrants are gold while the instruments' background and the outer edge of the gyro are Navy blue. The border of the insignia is red.

While in VT-6, the student undergoes two phases of training in the T-28B "TROJAN". They are radio instruments and cross-country navigation.

In the radio instrument phase, the student is taught the most complex and demanding aspect of piloting an aircraft. He learns the procedures and techniques necessary to qualify him in radio navigation. This knowledge will enable him to guide his aircraft safely through the most adverse weather conditions anywhere in the world.

Cross-country navigation is the final stage and "finishing school" of the student's fixed wing training. In these flights he is taught, under actual instrument flight conditions, the practical applications of all that he has learned. Now he is the pilot and flight planner and will use his training experience to guide his decisions enroute to

his destination. Upon completion at VT-6, the student is a highly qualified instrument pilot capable of flying from one base to another without visual references from take-off to within a few hundred feet at his destination.

Approximately 570 students report to VT-6 each year for their final fixed wing instrument training. Instruction commences with a "WELCOME ABOARD" lecture at 0700 on Monday for the class of 10 - 15 students. Here they learn what VT-6 does and what is expected from them. This is the start of four weeks instruction on the ground and in the air.

NAS Pensacola provides facilities and instructors for 35 hours of ground school and 8 hours of link training. In addition, VT-6 presents 6 hours of Flight Procedure lectures to better prepare the student for flight. The flight phase consists of 11 flights totaling 20 hours of instruction, where the students basic knowledge of instrument flight is developed into a highly technical skill which will aid him throughout his naval career. TRARON SIX averages 30 flight instructors flying 24 assigned T-28B aircraft. The flight instructors average between 50-60 hours of instructional flight time per month.

Upon leaving VT-6, a student is thoroughly qualified instrument pilot ready to begin specialized training in helicopters.

U. S. NAVAL AIR STATION

U. S. NAVAL AIR STATION PENSACOLA, FLORIDA

The Naval Air Station, Pensacola, Florida the "Annapolis of the Air" is the home of the Naval Air Training Command. It was naval aviation's first home and nearly all of the aviators in our Navy have been trained or served as instructors here at one time. Founded as a navy yard back

in 1826, nineteen years before Florida became a state, it was unanimously chosen to be the first naval air station in 1914. The wisdom of this choice has been proven throughout the years and NAS Pensacola remains one of the finest and largest air stations in the world.

The Chapel where all future Naval and Marine Corps aviators worship, the Naval Aviation Memorial Chapel, has a 23 karat gold window over the front entrance.





This tombstone marks the grave of Go-Ah, Geronimo's second wife. While Geronimo was held prisoner at Fort Pickens, on Santa Rosa Island, Go-Ah and her interpreter, the only civilians buried in the Barrancas National Cemetery, died here.



The Naval Air Station's primary function is to furnish logistic support to the Naval Air Basic Training Command in the coordination and direction of all basic flight training, ground training and specialized training in the aviation field. In addition, it is the home of two of its own squadrons, BTG-9, Basic Jet Training Group NINE; and METG (Multi-Engine Training Group), plus being the residence of the Navy's spectacular flight demonstration team, the "Blue Angels."

Each year 3,000 young men come to NAS Pensacola in quest of the coveted "Navy Wings of Gold." These future aviators embark on a career which boasts a proud tradition. For not only does the distinction of being the "Cradle of Naval Aviation" belong to Pensacola, but also the very settlement of our country had its historic founding on this soil where the air station now stands. It is with this tradition in mind we can proudly say, through the gates of the Naval Air Station Pensacola pass the finest pilots in the world.

TRAINING



Training Squadron Four is the final step of the Student Naval Aviator's training in the basic jet syllabus. Using the North American T2A "Buckeye", VT-4 instructs in air-to-air gunnery and carrier qualification.

These two phases of Training test the skills of the student aviator. If he is able to get hits in the towed 6' x 30' nylon banner at speeds in excess of 300 knots and is also able to complete carrier qualifying aboard the USS Lexington-CVS 16, he is ready to graduate from basic and move on to advanced training.

VT-4 is proud this year of its students, its instructors, and its maintenance personnel. Together they made 1964 an accident free year. By the end of 1964, VT4 had a consecutive accident free record of over 40,000 hours. The squadron had not had an accident since October 1962.

During 1964, 512 students completed Traron Four. As they headed for "Advanced" and ultimately their Wings of Gold, they were the most fully qualified jet student naval aviators to ever graduate from Basic. VT-4 takes pride in its contribution in to the training of these young men.

U. S. S. LEXINGTON...CVS-16



USS LEXINGTON—a name older than the United States itself, a title borne proudly by five men-of-war in the United States Navy.

USS LEXINGTON (CVS-16), launched in 1942 with the spirit of revenge guiding her down the ways, now steams under the famous banner of tradition set by herself and her namesakes in the course of America's history. The LEXINGTON tradition is deep, starting with the first USS LEXINGTON, an 86-foot brig in 1776, to today's 910-foot Lex. There have been five—all with the name LEXINGTON.

Prior to 1942, LEXINGTON was a term linked with the Revolutionary War. The simple farmers of that town in Massachusetts, ready to defend their rights on a minute's notice, fired the "shot heard 'round

the world" and became national symbols overnight. The name was to become an inspiration and in 1942, at the Battle of the Coral Sea, the sinking of a LEXINGTON gave birth to CVS-16.

While the fourth LEXINGTON (CV-2) fought off the attacking Japanese planes in the South Pacific, a nameless hull, destined to be a carrier, sat in the Fore River Yard in Quincy, Mass. When word was received in the states concerning the LEXINGTON tragedy, 23,000 workers at the shipyard united and, in a telegram to Frank Knox, then Secretary of the Navy, requested that the nameless hull be christened

LEXINGTON. The telegram explained that in 1925 the CV-2 was built at the Fore River Yard and that the loss of that ship was personal to those who had worked on her and were still employed there. On the following day a permission granted telegram was returned. Four months later, one year ahead of schedule, the new carrier slid down the ways, eager to avenge the death of her namesake.

LEXINGTON attained the revenge she sought in her many wartime exploits. By war's end she had destroyed more than 850 enemy planes, sank 300,000 tons of Japanese shipping, damaging another 600,000 tons. Fulfilling all the expectations her nation heaped upon her, the Lex became the symbol of the carrier fight in the Pacific. To the allies she was a link in the Free World's might, to the enemy she was the "Blue Ghost"—the ship that couldn't be sunk.

With the worldwide lull brought by the newfound peace, LEXINGTON was placed in the Reserve Fleet in Washington state. Then, with the new Communist threats in the Far East in the early 1950's, the Lex was recommissioned in August 1955. Complete with a new angled deck and other modern accessories, the Lex returned to her old battlegrounds with the Seventh Fleet, only this time with a different mission—to help preserve world peace.

From 1955 to May 1962, LEXINGTON has alternated between Far East deployments and west coast carrier qualifications for fleet pilots. In June 1962 she began a 15,000-mile journey from San Diego, Calif. to New York City, a voyage that led her around South America. While passing near the southernmost tip of the continent, Cape Horn, the Lex conducted air operations, the first carrier believed ever to do so in that storm-torn region.

On Oct. 1, 1962 LEXINGTON was redesignated an anti-submarine aircraft carrier.

The sudden Cuban crisis in latter October 1962 brought a sudden change in LEXINGTON's schedule. She was to have reported to Pensacola in the last week of November, and at the time of the President's decision to set the Cuban blockade, the Lex had more than two weeks repair work remaining in New York.

LEXINGTON received orders to prepare to get underway immediately, and four days later steamed from New York harbor. After loading ammunition aboard in Norfolk, Va. and having an airgroup assigned to her, Lady Lex reported for duty in Mayport, Fla. As negotiations proceeded in an attempt to ease the Cuban tension, LEXINGTON continued to operate in the area of Jacksonville. When the crisis finally relaxed, the Lex was issued her original orders to report to Pensacola, Fla. and arrived in that port Dec. 20, 1962.

In her new homeport, LEXINGTON serves as a training ship for novice Navy and Marine Corps pilots from Pensacola and Corpus Christi, Tex. When these young men receive their pilots' wings, they already will be familiar with day and night carrier flying.

Providing relief to hurricane victims is another responsibility taken by the Lex since reporting to the Gulf area. This aid includes the distribution of medicines and foodstuff.

But no matter where or what her immediate job is, Lex's long-range objective is to maintain the peace she fought so hard to win. Her spirit and readiness is something to be relied upon. In crises such as Formosa, Laos, Vietnam and Cuba, the modern Minutemen of CVS-16 were ready. They proved themselves worthy descendants of the illustrious Massachusetts' patriots whose battleground gave the ship its name.





N. A. A. S. MERIDIAN

The U.S. Naval Auxillary Air Station, Meridian, Mississippi, is part of the NAVAL AIR BASIC TRAINING COMMAND and is located 16 miles northeast of Meridian, Miss. It is the Navy's newest and most modern stateside installation.

The base was commissioned in a development status on December 31, 1959. A formal commissioning ceremony was held on 14 July 1961 at which time the Operational area (Centroid) was named McCain Field in honor of the late ADMIRAL John Sidney MC CAIN, USN.

NAAS MERIDIAN was carved out of rolling, timber-laden and marshland terrain. Actual construction work has been in progress for the past three and one half years.

To build the three runways, workmen gouged out hills, diverted streams, and filled in swamps. In one instance, an 80 foot hill was leveled and the earth used for fill, running up to 40 feet in a few of the lower sections.

The Navy's multi-million dollar jet training base, spread out over an 8,000 acre tract, commenced full operations in July, 1961. It is one of two stations in the United States where Navy Fliers receive basic jet training in the North American T2J-1 "Buckeye."

Approximately 500 student aviators will be trained yearly with about 200 on board at one time. Classes will be composed of Cadets, commissioned officers from the Naval Academy, NROTC, OCS, General Line, the Marine Corps, and a number of foreign students.

Students will come to Meridian after Pre-flight training at the U.S. Naval Air Station, Pensacola, Florida, and preliminary training at Saultley Field. They will be exposed to jets for the first time at Meridian and will accumulate about 100 hours flying time before moving on to training in more advanced types of aircraft at Corpus Christi, Texas.

HELICOPTER TRAINING

ELLYSON FIELD



On December 4, 1950 the Navy's only helicopter training base was commissioned at Ellyson Field, an auxiliary landing field located nine miles north of Pensacola. Helicopter Training Squadron Eight trains all the rotary wing pilots for the Navy, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard.

Present training at Ellyson calls for 80 flight hours over a 12-week period. It is available to seasoned aviators who wish to become proficient in this type of flying as well as to aviators who have just completed basic training.

In the past the primary use of the helicopter has been for rescue work. Now it is also being used extensively for antisubmarine warfare and the landing of assault troops. Some of the other uses for which the helicopter has been utilized are ship towing, aiding government surveyors working in rough terrain, stringing communications lines, photography, and reconnaissance. The versatility is possible since the helicopter has the ability to hover motionless or travel at speeds up to 210 miles an hour.

Training flights use not only Ellyson Field, but also five outlying (or satellite) fields. These are from three and a half to seven miles from the main base and vary in size from 160 to 640 acres.

For many the completion of helicopter training at Ellyson holds the long awaited commission and the coveted Wings of Gold, but for all it means special designation as a "Qualified Helicopter Pilot." The helicopter pilot is not a restricted pilot. He is however a member of that special fraternity that takes its place with the fleet providing unique operations, rescue and utility services. It also means flying antisubmarine missions as important members of Hunter Killer groups or the Marines who pilot the assault troop carriers for the new technique of amphibious warfare called vertical envelopment.



BASIC NAVAL AVIATION



The mission of the Basic Naval Aviation Officers School is to provide academic training and flight indoctrination for non-pilot aviation officers and officer candidates to prepare them for advanced and technical training leading to eventual designation as Naval Flight Officers or as non-flying Air Intelligence or Maintenance Officer. To accomplish this mission the sixteen-week curriculum is divided into two phases: Academics, constituting a total of 523 hours of classroom instruction in Navigation, Aircraft Communications, Technical Fundamentals, Fleet Aviation Operations, Meteorology, Air Intelligence and Recognition, Naval Leadership, Naval Aviation Information, and Flight Physiology and; Flight Indoctrination which is designed to (1) determine aeronautical adaptability, (2) permit selection for further training, and (3) provide standardized flight indoctrination for all students. This phase consists of 20 hours of flight in the UC-45J multi-engine trainer and the T1A and T2A jet trainers.

The Naval Flight Officer is a non-pilot officer responsible for the many and varied flight duties which do not involve actual control of the aircraft. The term "Naval Flight Officer" is new to Naval Aviation, but the non-pilot flight officer concept is nearly as old as Naval Aviation itself.

With acceptance of the "Second generation" of Naval aircraft, it became apparent that these

"new" machines were too complicated to be flown and repaired by the pilot alone. Specialists were needed to supervise aircraft maintenance and to assist the pilot in the performance of his inflight duties. During World War II these non-pilot specialists came into their own as navigators, bombardiers, weather observers, electronics and maintenance specialists, and intelligence officers. After the war they declined in numbers, but since Korea the need and number of these specialists has slowly grown as aircraft and technology have developed.

The Basic NAO School was established in July 1960 as part of the Training Department of NAS Pensacola, and became a commissioned unit on August 3, 1963.

Today, Basic NAO School provides the "Second Seat" man for current fleet aircraft with their complex weapons and electronic systems. The A-3, "Skywarrior", A-5, "Vigilante", A-6, "Intruder", F-4, Phantom II, P-3, "Orion", E-1B, "Tracer", and E-2A, "Hawkeye" were designed and built to include one or more Naval Flight Officers in the crew.

The need is now; the opportunity is here; Basic NAO School provides the vital first step toward a rewarding career as a Naval Flight Officer.
